Traditional Interment

Traditional ground burial includes a casket, vault, and personalized bronze memorial with a graveside service for family and friends. Specialty gardens, Serenity and Harmony Hill offer exclusive memorialization. Serenity features private mausoleums and benches amid lakeside views. Harmony Hill offers upright granite monuments atop the highest point of the memorial gardens.



Cremation Inurnment

Cremation continues to gain popularity as a preferred method of disposition. We offer a variety of memorial options, such as urns, niches, benches, columbaria, and pedestals, in addition to our cremation gardens. Our new **Dulaney Valley Cremation Center** provides cremation services on our premises, providing families with the peace of mind knowing that their loved ones remain in our care.



Mausoleum Entombment
